# ENGLISH A PRACTISE EXERCISE TWO

## SUBJECT AND VERB AGREEMENT - Rules

**Review:** 1. The subject of a sentence 2. Singular and Plural Verbs

## Rule 1

A singular subject takes a singular Verb.

- e.g. (1) The boy walks to school. (Singular Subject The Boy). (Singular Verb walks).
  - (2) My mother **cooks** delicious foods. (Singular Subject My Mother. (Singular Verb Walks)

# Rule 2

A plural subject takes a plural Verb.

- e.g. (1) The men **work** in the city. (Plural Subject The men). (Plural Verb work)
  - (2) The ducks **swim** in the pond. (Plural Subject The ducks). (Plural Verb swim)

## Rule 3

If two subjects are joined by <u>and</u> (whether the subjects are singular or plural), they require a plural Verb.

e.g. (1) Mary <u>and her friends study together</u>. (Subject – Mary and her friends). (Plural Verb – study).
(2) She <u>and I have similar computers</u>. (Subject – She and I). (Plural Verb – have).

## Rule 4

The Pronouns each, everyone, everybody, anyone, anybody, someone, somebody, no one, everything, etc. ALWAYS take a singular Verb.

e.g. (1) Each of the girls dances well. (Singular Verb because of the Pronoun each).(2) Somebody talks too much. (Singular Verb because of the Pronoun somebody).

#### Rule 5

The Pronouns I and You take a plural verb.

e.g. (1) I walk to school every day. (Plural Verb because of the Pronoun I).
(2) You are late. (Plural Verb because of the Pronoun You)

**EXCEPTION** - We always say <u>I was</u>.

e.g. <u>I was</u> driving slowly when I got a flat tyre.

## Rule 6

A Collective Noun when singular, takes a singular Verb. When plural, it takes a plural Verb.

e.g. (1) A <u>flock</u> of birds **flies** overhead. (Singular Collective Nouns – flock). (Singular Verb – flies).
(2) Many <u>packs</u> of cards were left on the table. (Plural Collective Noun – packs). (Plural Verb – were).
