Lesson No. 1

Activity

- 1. Read the summary of the play. (pages V-XII)
- 2. Read and note the list of characters. (page 1)
- 3. What is a 'tempest'? Explain in your own words.
- 4. Revise Act 1 Scene 1. This scene takes place on a ship at sea during a terrible storm. Discuss how the title of the novel is appropriate for the scene.
- 5. Consider the activities on (page 2) No. 1, Find suitable responses for a to d.
- 6. Read and interpret the notes on (page 2) for 'Challenging Authority'.
 - (a) Who are the high-status passengers?
 - (b) Who is in charge?
 - (c) Who orders the king and the other aristocrats off the deck?

Lesson No. 2

- 1. Familiarize yourself with the meaning of word(s) used before reading.
- Read over Act 1 Scene 1, 'A Ship at Sea'. In your own words explain lines 15-16 (page 3)
- 3. Study the notes on 'More Challenges to Authority'. Discuss how someone with the lowest social status speaks to his social superiors with little or no respect.
- 4. Read the notes on 'The Storm, Another Challenge' (page 4). The storm also represents a challenge to Humanity's authority over nature.
- 5. Study the vocabulary list on page 4
- 6. Pretend to be Boatswain. Read the lines spoken by him aloud.
- 7. Now, pretend to be Gonzalo. Read his lines aloud. (Nos. 6 and 7 should be done in pairs but if you are alone you can pretend to be both characters.)
- 8. Write a summary of Act 1 Scene 1 describing the setting and explaining the characters feelings towards the shipwreck.
