CSEC ${ }^{1} 2020$ Results
The Ministry of Education in Guyana has expressed great dissatisfaction at the 2020 CSEC and CAPE results. ${ }^{2}$ Jamaica as well has expressed similar concern. ${ }^{3}$ Some of the issues raised by the Ministry have also affected us. ${ }^{4}$ However, we are presenting a preliminary analysis of our 2020 CSEC results. This year a number of 61 students - 42 females and 19 males sat the CSEC examinations. SVN, as you are aware has an open policy for admissions, meaning that we admit any student regardless of the score obtained at the NGSA ${ }^{5}$ examinations. The average NGSA score for these students is 471 , the highest being 526 and the lowest 360 .

On account of COVID19, the examinations were held in July-August rather than in the customary period of May-June. We had no physical contact with our students from the beginning of March, though the Ministry of Education allowed students and teachers to return to school for a period of one month prior to the commencement of the exams.

The Caribbean Examinations Council (CXC) decided to change the format of the examinations as well. For every subject excepting Spanish there was a single multiple-choice paper which, along with the School Based Assessment (SBA), was the basis for the awarding of grades. This was no doubt a cause of great concern for us, and we were eager to see what would be the variation from previous years. We are happy to announce that the results of 2020 were very much in line with the results of previous years at SVN.

While we had very limited physical contact with students, we were able to quickly put in place an aggressive on-line programme, not only for the class of 2020 but for the entire school as well. The main hindrance in the on-line delivery had to do with students not having computers and internet access. Frequent power outage also posed a great challenge.

## Overall Passes and Matriculation

This year we have an overall pass ${ }^{\mathbf{6}}$ of $\mathbf{9 6 . 6 0 \%}$, as compared to $95.80 \%$ in 2019. While the Ministry of Education has not yet declared the results, we know that Jamaica has recorded a pass rate of just over $76.5 \%{ }^{7}$ and the Education Department there has expressed grave concerns about it.

For matriculation purposes a student must pass a minimum of 5 subjects which must include English Language and Mathematics. In 2020, there is $100 \%$ pass in English Language, but in Mathematics three students failed to make the pass grade resulting in a $95.08 \%$ pass which is an improvement over 2019 with $91.86 \%$. This means that $\mathbf{5 8}$ out of 61 students matriculated giving an overall $95.08 \%$ as against $90.70 \%$ in 2019. Of the 58 students who matriculated, 56 did so with 10 subjects and more.

## Special Achievements

Over the years we pay special attention to our students with the lowest National Grade Six Assessment (Common Entrance) scores. Two of our students, Chris and Christal Dundas, siblings from St. Cuthberth's Mission who had NGSA scores of 360 and 384 respectively, matriculated with 14 and 13 subjects each while, a third student, Said Jeffers (NGSA 401) did so with 9 subjects and Nishida Persaud (NGSA 419) with 13 subjects including 5 grade ones and 5 grade twos. Three students came to SVN without any NGSA reference: Shivani Ramautar who passed in all the 14 subjects she took and Ziphena

[^0]Bailey and Nalini Ramnarine of the Prabhu Sharan Home at Cornelia Ida gained 10 ( 3 grade ones, 5 grade twos and 2 grade threes) and 5 subjects respectively. We take this opportunity to congratulate these students and wish them well in their future undertakings

In addition, two of our students Karan Kishandayal obtained 9 grade ones, 3 grade twos, and 2 grade threes and Narissa Naikram also obtained 9 grade ones, 5 grade twos and 1 grade three while Navita Singh, Aveena Harripersaud and Ravindra Persaud obtained 8 grade ones each. In all at SVN, 57 of the 61 students passed with 10 subjects and more, with the remaining 4 gaining $9,8,7$, and 5 subjects.

## Subject Performance

2020 has seen an increase in the number of subjects - Agriculture Science, Biology, EDPM ${ }^{8}$, English Language, ${ }^{9}$ Human and Social Biology, Information Technology, Integrated Science, Office Administration, Physics, Principles of Business, and Social Studies - with $100 \%$ passes from 9 in 2019 to 11 in 2020. In comparison to 2019, five subjects showed improvement ranging from $1.35 \%$ to $4.59 \%$ - Caribbean History (4.36\%), English Literature (4.59\%), Mathematics (3.22\%), Physics (3.03\%), and Spanish (1.36\%), while in the following five subjects there has been a decline ranging from

[^1]$1.00 \%$ to $13.57 \%$ - Additional Mathematics $13.57 \%$, Chemistry $2.45 \%$, Economics $4.64 \%$, Geography $2.75 \%$, and Principles of Accounts $1.00 \%$.

## Overall Grade Performance

We know that the more grade one passes we obtain the better will be our overall performance. This year shows a decline in grade one passes from $45.67 \%$ to $43.56 \%$, while grade two passes increased from $22.15 \%$ to $28.98 \%$. In terms of grade three, there has been a drop from $14.05 \%$ in 2019 to $12.18 \%$ this year. An encouraging feature of the results in 2020, is the decline in the failing grades with grade 4 dropping from $3.04 \%$ to $1.58 \%$ and grade 5 from $0.22 \%$ to $0.12 \%$.

Rank Order (Mock) Exams
All schools in Guyana are required to provide CXC with an Order of Merit for each student in each subject which he or she intends to write at the May-June CSEC exams. The Order of Merit is based on three areas: School Based Assessment (SBA), the student's rank in each subject, and the expected grades. The data for the latter two is obtained from the Rank Order exams usually held in February at SVN. Our Rank Order exams are held in such strict conditions that the scores and ranks awarded are an accurate guide and prediction of the CSEC result. Over the years there has been a close correlation between SVN's rank order exam and CSEC grades.
